There does seem to be a confusion between reports/accounts filed with the CC and reports/accounts scrutinised by the CC, ie, the logic of OSCR taking extra care with the cross border charities with incomes under £25,000 is the assumption that as charities with incomes over £25,000 have to file reports/accounts, these are also scrutinised by the CC (para 35 of the consultation), which they are not.
